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

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



President Jonathan Lambert



LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS



ELLEN KURAS, ASC Director, Cinematographer, and Producer

Academy Award-nominee and Primetime Emmy winner *Ellen Kuras*, ASC makes significant contribution to cinema with her visionary, eclectic work as a director-cinematographer. One of the first women members of the American Society of Cinematographers (ASC), she is widely regarded as a pioneer for all filmmakers. She easily moves between the studio and independent film worlds with a repertoire that includes narrative, documentary, music films and commercials. Since 1990, she has received many awards, beginning with a Student Academy Award for her first film as a cinematographer on the documentary *Samsara*. For her first film as a director, *The Betrayal (Nerakhoon)*, she was nominated for an Academy Award and a Spirit Award,

Well-known for her visually stunning work on *Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind* (2004) and *Blow* (2001), she is the unprecedented three-time winner of the Best Dramatic Cinematography at Sundance. She has also won the Eastman Kodak Focus Award, Women in Film Kodak Vision Award and has been nominated numerous times for the Emmys and the Independent Spirit Awards. She was the first cinematographer to receive a Gotham Award for her entire body of work.



Ellen has collaborated with directors such as Michael Gondry, Martin Scorsese, Spike Lee, Sam Mendes, Jim Jarmusch, Errol Morris and Rebecca Miller. With Steve Zaillian, she worked on HBO's *The Night of* and with Martin Scorsese on the pilot of *Vinyl* as a second unit director/cinematographer. After her TV directorial debut on USA Network's *Falling Water*, she immediately went on to direct episodes 7 and 8 of the Netflix Original show *Ozark*, starring Jason Bateman and Laura Linney. She then directed an episode of *Legion* with Noah Hawley, two episodes of the AMC show *The Son* and two episodes of the new series *Umbrella Academy* for Netflix.

For her latest project, George Clooney invited her to join him and Grant Heslov to direct *Catch 22*, a six-episode limited series slated to premier on Hulu. She also directs commercials for clients such as NIKE, COKE, APPLE and DELTA. Ellen has been honored in special artist retrospectives at the Wexner Center for the Arts and the Walker Center for the Arts in Minneapolis. She serves as a grand jury member for various films festivals, including the Sundance Film Festival and International Jury of the Berlin Film Festival. She has maintained her membership in the Academy since 1997.



MALCOLM MCDOWELL Actor and Writer

Malcolm McDowell is an English actor, known for his boisterous and often times villainous roles. In a career spanning over 50 years, McDowell has played varied film roles across different genres as a character actor.

Born in Leeds, England, to working-class parents, Malcolm hated his parents' ways. His father was packed Malcolm off to boarding school at age 11, to give him a good start in life. While at school, he decided he wanted to become an actor. He attended the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts (LAMDA) to study acting. Meanwhile, he worked at his parents' pub until the pub went bankrupt. He then held a variety of jobs, from coffee salesman to messenger.

He made his first big-screen appearance in *Poor Cow* (1967), although his two-minute scene was ultimately cut from the completed film. Soon after, he caught the attention of director Lindsay Anderson who cast him in the role of a rebellious student in his film *If....* (1968). The film catapulted Malcolm to stardom in Britain but failed elsewhere. He felt so enthusiastic about the film's success that he wanted to do another right away. He wrote what became the semi-autobiographical *O Lucky Man!* (1973). Then he starred as Alex DeLarge in Stanley Kubrick's controversial *A Clockwork Orange* (1971), a role that gave him world fame, and legendary status (although typecasting him in villainous roles).

In early 1976, he spent nearly a year working on what later emerged as one of the most infamous films of all time, the semi-pornographic *Caligula* (1979), financed by *Penthouse* magazine founder <u>Bob Guccione</u>. Around that time, the British film industry collapsed, forcing him to move to America to continue working. His first American film was *Time After Time* (1979). He then did *Britannia Hospital* (1982), the last part of Lindsay Anderson's working-class trilogy that started with *If...* (1968).

In the mid-1980s, the years of alcohol and drug abuse took its toll on him. His black hairs turned gray, making him look older than he real age, so nobody wanted to cast him for in younger roles. When the big roles dried up, he did many B-rated movies. The 1990s were kinder to him. In 1994, he was cast as Dr. Tolian Soran, the man who killed Captain James T. Kirk in **Star Trek: Generations** (1994). Now back on the track, he played villains again, including Benny Barratt in the classic BBC miniseries **Our Friends in the North** (1996).

McDowell has had a string of roles on numerous television series such as *Entourage* (2006–2007; 2009–2011), *Heroes* (2007–2008), *Franklin* & *Bash* (2011–2014) and *Mozart in the Jungle* (2014–2018). He narrated the documentary *The Compleat Beatles* (1982), and in recent years has become a prolific voice actor in films, television series and video games such as *Metalocalypse* (2007–2012), *Bolt* (2008), *Fallout 3* (2008), *God of War III* (2010), *Call of Duty: Black Ops III* (2015) and *The Elder Scrolls Online* (2015). He received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in 2012.

Today, with more than 100 films under his belt, he is one of the busiest actors in America. He appeared in seven films in 2018, currently has eight projects in pre-production and three more announced. He resides with his family in Ojai.

On November 3 at 7 PM, a screening of O Lucky Man! will be followed by a Q&A with Mr. McDowell led by actor/writer Peter Fox. A reception follows in the Art Center Gallery.

Ojai Film Festival received over 70 entries from across America and Europe for the third annual Screenplay Competition. A panel of judges read each entry in order to name twenty finalists. The grand prize for the winning script includes a LIVE READ on November 4. Miguel Orozco, Artistic Director of Ánimo Theater Company, will direct and use his company's roster of talent to fill out the cast of Matadora for the festival performance. The winning script will also have a Teaser Scene, produced by John Branagan, for the writers to use in their promotion of the script.

The Winning Script - Matadora by Lisa Cole, Rick Najera, and Mark Monroe







Set in Mexico during the time of the Mexican Revolution, Matadora tells the story of a brave young woman, who disguises herself as a man and becomes a bullfighter to save her family from ruin. The screenplay is full of action, adventure, and memorable characters - particularly 20-year-old Esperanza, a strong female protagonist who faces an often-brutal world with unflinching courage and determination.

Academy nominated for Best Animated Feature, *Loving Vincent* is an ode to the works, life and times of Vincent van Gogh. Created by 67 artists in Gdansk, Poland, the film uses van Gogh's brush techniques and expressive strokes to tell the story of a young man sent to deliver the artist's final letter to Auvers-sur-Oise, France. Throughout the story, Armand, the man with the letter, meets many of the people of the village who not only knew Vincent, but also inspired his art. Armand becomes increasingly fascinated in the psyche and fate of Van Gogh as numerous suspicious details fail to add up.

An Afternoon with Eva Marie Saint



Academy Award and Emmy Award-winning actress Eva Marie Saint is the subject of Women in Film Legacy Series Film to be shown at Ojai Film Festival November 9



The Ojai Film Festival and Women In Film (WIF) will present a Legacy Series event with acclaimed actress Eva Marie Saint on Friday, November 9 at the Ojai Art Center. The intimate filmed interview produced by WIF's Ilene Kahn Power and Dorothea

Petrie, directed by Petra Haffter, and edited by David Flores and Zachary Weintraub, is a 40-minute retrospective of the Academy, and Emmy award-winning star's career in film, television and stage. The event begins at 4 pm with the screening, followed by Q&A with Ms. Saint. A reception will follow. The Legacy Series was created to document the personal and creative worlds of exceptional women in Hollywood whose accomplishments paved the way for new generations of women working in the film and television industries.

Eva Marie Saint is that rare phenomenon, an actress whose career in films, television and stage has spanned more than 70 years. She began her distinguished film career opposite Marlon Brando in On the Waterfront (1954), for which she was honored with an Academy Award. She went on to star in several other memorable movies, including North by Northwest (1959), A Hatful of Rain (1957), That Certain Feeling (1956), Raintree County (1957), Exodus (1960), All Fall Down (1962), 36 Hours (1964), The Sandpiper (1965), The Russians Are Coming the Russians Are Coming! (1966), Grand Prix (1966), The Stalking Moon (1968), Loving (1970), Nothing In Common (1986) and I Dreamed Of Africa (2000). Her recent films include Because of Winn-Dixie (2005), Don't Come Knocking (2005), Superman Returns (2006) and Winter's Tale (2014) starring Colin Farrell.

The names of her leading men read like a galaxy: Marlon Brando, Montgomery Clift, Cary Grant, Henry Fonda, Paul Newman, Gregory Peck, Richard Burton, Warren Beatty, James Garner, Jason Robards, George C. Scott, Burt Lancaster and Tom Hanks, with whom she co-starred in Nothing in Common.

In television, Ms. Saint's first Emmy nomination was for *Paddy Chayefsky's Middle* of the Night for The Philco Television Playhouse (1954). In 1955, she sang the role of Emily in the live TV musical adaptation of Thornton Wilder's Our Town with Frank Sinatra and Paul Newman, winning another Emmy nomination. Her third Emmy nod came for the Hallmark Hall of Fame presentation of Taxi!! (1978), and a fourth nomination came for the mini-series How the West Was Won (1977). In 1990, on her fifth Emmy nomination, she won the coveted award for the miniseries People Like Us (1990).

"Eva Marie Saint's stellar seven decade career has had a huge impact on women in film and television today", said Women In Film Board Member Ilene Kahn Power, Executive Producer of The Legacy Series. "It was vital to us at Women In Film to share her remarkable, brilliant story with details of her family life, her beginnings as an actress and the roles that set her apart. We are committed to preserving these stories because we believe that women deserve to value and share their own history."

Following the Legacy Film screening will be a Q&A with Ms. Saint. The audience will have an opportunity to ask questions. After the Q&A, a reception will be held with Ms. Saint, Women In Film members, Ojai Film Festival Board members and Festival attendees in the Art Center Gallery. Beverages and appetizers will be served.
